#### **Buckeye Elementary Card System**

If rules are violated, the following will apply. All consequences (card flips) will be documented by the teacher.

Each homeroom teacher will have a chart with a pocket for each student on it. Each student will have five colored cards in his/her pocket that will be "flipped" or "turned" if he/she breaks any of the school rules. The colors are: green, yellow, blue, orange and blue.

First Offense Flip green card...Yellow is showing...Warning

Second Offense Flip yellow card...Blue is showing...5 minute time out

Third Offense Flip blue card...Orange is showing...5 minute time out (teacher

call)

Fourth Offense Flip orange card...Red is showing...Office referral (principal call)

Details...

Students get a fresh start each day. A behavior calendar will be used and sent home daily. Students who have less than four card flips and have not received an office bus referral will qualify to attend a Fun Friday each week. Students who are green all month will be on the Green Team and receive an award at the end of the month. Other consequences may be issued by the building principal for more serious behavior without following the discipline steps listed above.
