#### Buckeye:

The following are just a few of the positive things that are happening at Buckeye:

- Our buildings and grounds committee (Buckeye BGT) has been busy completing a needs assessment at Buckeye that will help us reach Goal #5. They have measured rooms in the building and have gathered data that will help as we begin to have conversations about the needs we have. In addition, the committee spoke at a Buckeye Team meeting and distributed a survey that will help with the process. Special thanks to Mindy Hiltbrand, Kary Welker, Chelsea Green and Katie Crouse for serving on the committee.
- The Buckeye kindergarten team has implemented a program during their half hour Quaker Time block called The Switcheroo. During Quaker Time, our tier 3 students receive pull-out learning support services and our tier 1 and 2 students remain with their teachers in their classrooms to receive instruction. The Switcheroo concept involves dividing the tier 1 and 2 students into appropriate skill groups and switching to another teacher for Quaker Time. By dividing the students into appropriate groups based on specific skills, our teachers are able to further differentiate instruction to meet the needs of all students, which will help us reach Goal #1. The Switcheroo also enables teachers to enrich the curriculum for our students who are able to achieve at a higher level.
- Our first graders performed a program entitled, <u>Our First Grade Christmas Program</u>, for our families on December 11, 2013. The students did a fantastic job and there were countless positive comments from parents, grandparents and friends. The first grade team and Mrs. Samu should be commended, and their efforts are greatly appreciated! Having students perform for their families will help us reach Goal #2.
- The Salvation Army Kettle Day will take place on December 17, 2013 this year. Last year, families at Buckeye Elementary donated over 425 pounds of pennies and we are hoping to surpass that amount this year. Mr. Jason Price, a representative from the Salvation Army and his team will come to Buckeye on Kettle Day with their giant kettle to weigh the pennies and declare a winning classroom. Teachers are able to integrate this activity into instruction, which will help us to meet Goal #1.

The presenters at the conference offered a wealth of knowledge and practical strategies in the areas of decoding, fluency, reading comprehension, and integrated writing. \*At the end of November, the results of the 3<sup>rd</sup> Grade Fall Reading OAA were released. The results for our Really 3<sup>rd</sup> Graders are as follows:

Total number of students who took the test: = 140

Data Regarding Passage of the OAA – Cut Score of 400 or Higher

Number of students earning a passing score of 400 or above = 89 (63%)

Number of students earning a score of 399 or below = 51 (36%)

<u>Data Regarding Passage of The Third Grade Guarantee – Cut Score of 392 or</u> Higher

Number of students earning a score of 392 or higher = 107 (76%)

Number of students earning a score of 391 or below = 33 (23%)

We have met as a third grade staff to review all student data. We have made plans to regroup students according to these results in order to ensure that all students receive the appropriate reading instruction and intervention.
