## 12-092 Certificated Substitute Teachers 2011/12

The Superintendent recommends the Board of Education approve <u>Jacque</u> <u>Rich</u> as a substitute teacher for the 2011/12 school year pending the BCI/FBI results and certificate renewal.

## 12-093 Classified Substitutes for 2011/12

The Superintendent recommends the Board of Education approve the following classified cafeteria, custodial and/or aide substitutes for the 2011/12 school year pending the BCI/FBI results:

# 12-094 Approval of Salem Public Library Trustee

The Superintendent recommends the Board of Education approve the reappointment of <u>Margaret Gibbs</u> to serve a full seven year term, without compensation, as a Trustee of the Library Board to begin January 1, 2012 through December 31, 2018.

# 12-095 Common Core Standards Adoption

The Superintendent recommends the Board of Education adopt the Common Core Standards in English Language Arts and Mathematics as well as the revision to Ohio's academic content standards in Science and Social Studies. The standards will be effective in 2014-2015 when newly aligned assessments also will be implemented.

## 12-096 House Bill 136 Resolution

WHEREAS, the Ohio House of Representative is currently considering legislation that would significantly expand the availability of vouchers for students to attend private or parochial schools; and

WHERAS, this legislation would grant vouchers to any public school student in Ohio to request and be granted a voucher, subject only to a family income standard of \$95,000 or less; and

WHEREAS, such vouchers would be granted without regard to the academic performance of the public school that the student is assigned to attend; and

## **CONSENT AGENDA, continued**

WHEREAS, the bill provides that students already enrolled in private or parochial schools would be eligible for such vouchers; and

WHEREAS, students receiving vouchers would be able to retain any excess funds in those instances where the cost of the tuition is less than the value of the voucher for use in any private school or college in Ohio; and

WHEREAS, the operation of the proposed program would take dollars directly from the already financially beleaguered local public school districts resulting in fewer resources for the education of the remaining students;

NOW THERFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Salem Board of Education hereby express its opposition to this legislation, HB 136 School choice; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Salem Board of Education expresses its opposition to any legislation that seeks to transfer public dollars to support private education; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Treasurer be directed to spread this resolution upon the minutes of the Board of Education and that copies of the resolution be forwarded to members of the Ohio House of Representatives.
