WHEREAS, Internal Revenue Service (IRS) Ruling 2006-43 has clarified that the Board is required to take formal action in order to maintain such a pick-up of employee contributions.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Western Reserve Local Board of Education;

SECTION I

That the Board reaffirms it will pick up the percentage of the employee's share of mandatory STRS contributions and will pick up the percentage of the employee's share of mandatory SERS contributions as specified in previous Board resolutions

and/or previously approved individual employment contracts and collective bargaining agreements, in addition to the Board's share of such contributions.

SECTION II

Salary reduction pick-up and fringe benefit pick-up will be designated as employee contributions paid by the Board. The individual employment contracts shall specify whether the fringe benefit pick-up contributions in the groups subject to this action will be treated as additional compensation for retirement purposes.

SECTION III

It is found and determined that all formal actions of this Board concerning or related to the adoption of this Resolution were adopted in an open meeting of this Board, and all deliberations of this Board and any of its committees that resulted in such formal actions were adopted in meetings open to the public, in compliance with all applicable requirements of the Ohio Revised Code.
