3. It is recommended that the following Resolution acknowledging the urgent necessity to make immediate correction of the electrical issues at the K-12 facility be approved:

WHEREAS, pursuant to R.C. §3313.46, this Board is required to follow the competitive bidding procedures in letting contracts to build, repair, enlarge, improve, or demolish school facilities the cost of which will exceed \$25,000.00, which includes advertising for bids for a period of two weeks and awarding the contract to the lowest responsible bidder following such advertisement; and

WHEREAS, exceptions to this requirement are provided in cases of urgent necessity and/or for the security and protection of school property; and

WHEREAS, the Board has experience significant electrical power interruptions at the new K-12 building since January 1, 2013 that resulted in repairs cost of approximately \$7,000.00; and

WHEREAS, the Board is advised by the electrical engineer who was involved in the original building design that immediate and additional upgrades are necessary in order to prevent further power interruptions, interference with the operation of the facility and the instructional program and to protect the school property from further damage and/or destruction;

WHEREAS, under these circumstances, compliance with the procedures prescribed by R.C. §3313.46 would delay the necessary electrical power upgrades an excessive period, thereby creating an unsafe condition and would lead to continued avoidable operational interruptions and repair expenses for the 2014-2015 school year; and

WHEREAS, based on the foregoing facts and circumstances, the Board believes that an urgent necessity exists to immediately begin the electrical power upgrades at the new K-12 building in order to protect school property, and that contracts should and must be let without following the procedures set forth in R.C. §3313.46 as soon as reasonably possible.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Education of the Western Reserve Local School District, County of Mahoning, State of Ohio, that:

Section 1: It is found, determined and declared pursuant to R.C. §3313.46 that there is an urgent necessity for the Board to dispense with the requirements of R.C. §3313.46 regarding the electrical power upgrades at the new K-12 building.

Section 2: It is further found and determined that compliance with the statutory procedures of R.C. §3313.46 would unduly delay the electrical power upgrades at the new K-12 building and jeopardize the school property.

<u>Section 3</u>: It is further found and determined that the June 16, 2014 quote from Tri-Area Electric (attached as Exhibit A) is reasonable and responsive to the immediate needs of the Board regarding the Electrical Power Upgrades at the new K-12 building.

<u>Section 4</u>: The Board approves the proposed electrical power upgrades contained in Exhibit A and approves entering into a contract for the services contained in that quote from Tri-Area Electric. The Superintendent and Treasurer are instructed to take those steps necessary to make the recommended electrical repairs and upgrades.

Section 5: It is further found and determined that all formal actions of this Board concerning and relating to the adoption of this resolution were adopted in an open meeting of this Board; that all deliberations of this Board and any of its committees that resulted in such formal action were adopted in meetings open to the public; and that all notices to the members of the Board of Education, media and those requesting notice were accomplished in compliance with all requirements of the applicable laws including, but not limited to, R.C. §121.22.
